Leadership Attends “The Art of Mental Management” Program in Langkawi, Malaysia

Our Dean, Capt. Sanjay Anand, SM, and Director Principal, Dr. Sunita Anand, attended “The Art of Mental Management” program in Langkawi, Malaysia on 26 & 27 September 2025. Organised by the Central Group of Companies, the program brought together leaders to explore mental training and neuroscience-based learning strategies. Sessions were led by Dr. Rahul Arun Bharadwaj, Brain Scientist at the Lieber Institute for Brain Development, Johns Hopkins Medicine, USA. He explained how mental processes influence behaviour, decision-making, emotional balance, and academic performance. The two-day training introduced practical frameworks to improve student focus, motivation, emotional resilience, and overall classroom well-being. The insights gained will help strengthen future school initiatives and support a more mindful and effective learning environment.

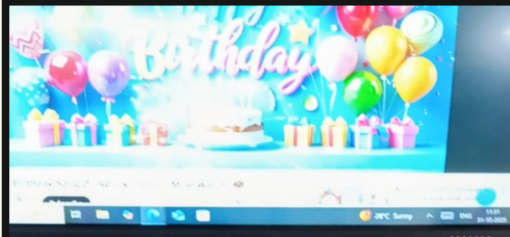
An Electrifying Finale: Doonites Display Skill, Spirit, and Sportsmanship on the Court!

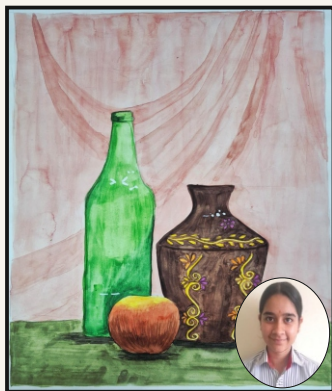
