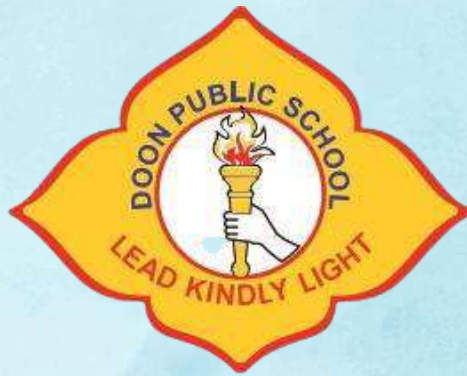

Smart Parenting

Here are **some tips** to make this summer a joyful period.

- ✚ Inspire your children to read for at least 20 minutes a day. Remember, to inspire we need to practice what we preach.
- ✚ Make time to read about the history of the places you are visiting, on your stay-cations and/or vacations. Try comparing and contrasting the history of the community in which you live to that of the place you visited.
- ✚ Partake at least two meals together with your children. Impart them the importance and hard work of the farmers and ask them not to waste their food.
- ✚ Have conversations about the engineering and innovative thinking required to create the many things you get to explore at your summer destinations (amusement parks, swimming pools, airports, train stations, etc.)
- ✚ Allow them to wash-down their own plates after every meal. Children absorb dignity of labour from such activities.

- ✚ Let them assist you in cooking. Allow them to make their own vegetable and fruit salad.
- ✚ If possible, allow them to keep a pet dog or a cat or any animal or fish.
- ✚ Encourage your children to keep a journal to venerate their summer and prep them for the infamous back to school writing prompt 'What did you do this summer?'

Ensure that you click **one photograph** of your child while performing each activity and send its **printout** to the school for keeping in the **portfolio**. Kindly limit it to one photograph per activity.



1. Grow any spice/medicinal plant/herb. Explore its health benefits. Nurture it and bring it to school.

2. Create a bookmark for yourself.



3. Create a bird feeder and keep it in your balcony.

4. Plan a surprise for your father for the Father's Day (19th June).



5. Build a card tower.

6. Do simple household chores everyday (like setting table for meal, watering plants, folding your clothes, making your bed, arranging your cupboard etc).








7. Sink or Float Activity

What you have to do:

- Choose 10-15 different kinds of vegetables.
- Take a bucket with water.
- Take each vegetable one by one.
- First share your predictions, "what you think will happen when put it in a bucket of water. Will it float or sink. Write in an A4 sheet.
- Put the vegetable in the bucket. Observe whether floating or sinking. Write your observations in the same A4 sheet alongside the prediction.
- Compare with your predictions.
- Share your experience in the class
