Smart Parenting

Here are **some tips** to make this summer a joyful period.

- ✚ Inspire your children to read for at least 20 minutes a day. Remember, to inspire we need to practice what we preach.

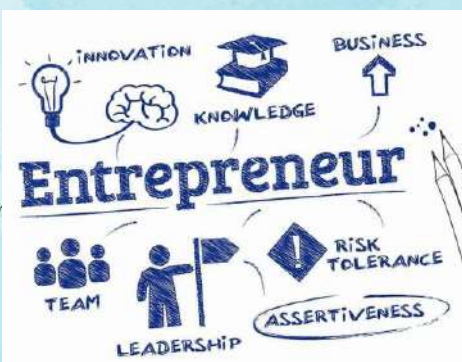
4. Learn a new skill during summer break (examples any instrument, language, dance form, baking etc.)

Make a PowerPoint presentation to showcase your product and company.

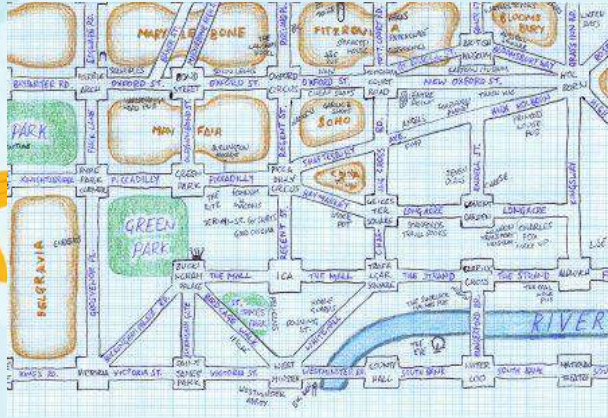
Slide 1 - name of your company

11. Learn at least five magic tricks. Demonstrate these in school as part of the magic show.

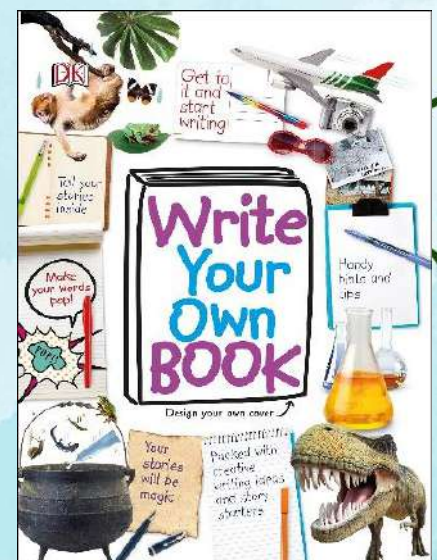


12. My Book - "Daring Women"

- f. Back page - 'About the Book', 'About the Author'

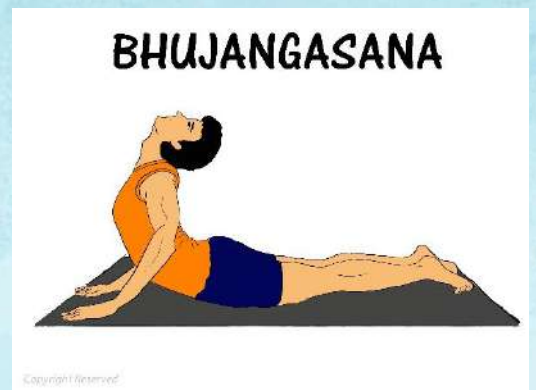
- ✓ Use pictures/quotes/stories/anecdotes, art & craft to design the book.

13. Watch any classical black & white movie. Describe it during fusion time in school.

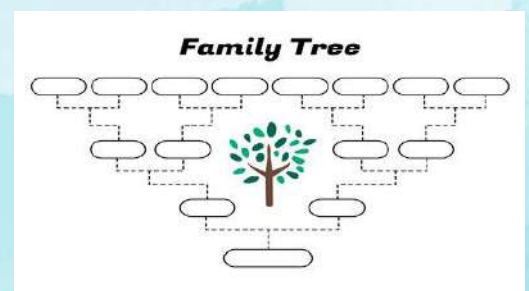
14. Perform the following Asanas and make a Word Document about their benefits (include pictures of yourself)
